



**Vet Exemption  
Filing Period  
Ends May First**

Veterans in this county have just eight weeks to file claim for the annual \$1000 property tax exemption. Veterans Service Officer Mrs. Sarah Bridges has warned veterans in cooperation with the Assessor's Office. The filing period opened Monday, March 6 and continues through Monday May 1.

Tax exemption claims or requests must be renewed each year, at the Assessor's office, located at Torrance City Hall.

THE FILING period was shortened last year to its present length, under terms of a law passed in 1959 by the State Legislature. Previously, veterans had until the last Monday in May to claim the exemption. Now the period is set statewide from the first Monday in March to the first Monday in May.

California grants \$1000 property tax exemptions to resident veterans of wars or campaigns, including women veterans. Eligibility is limited to veterans who do not own property with an assessed value of \$5000 or more, although under state community property law the veteran and his wife together may own property up to an assessed value of \$10,000 and remain eligible.

VETERANS from other states living in California may still qualify for the exemption if otherwise eligible, under a recent Attorney General's opinion nullifying "Proposition 11" at the last election. The proposition would have imposed a cutoff date for the exemption granted veterans not previously residents of California, but was declared invalid because of a conflict with another proposition on the ballot.

Exemption requests must also be filed with the City Assessor if the veteran owns property inside city limits.

Wives of veterans may file on the veteran's behalf if more convenient.
