To Demonstrate 'Closed Chest' Heart Massage

Doctors at Harbor General Hospital will have the chance to learn the new "closed chest" cardiac resuscitation method Tuesday when a clinic is held in the hospital's auditorium, it was reported today.

An expected attendance of fifty doctors, interns, residents, and staff will be shown a training film and given instruction on the new method, according to the Los Angeles County Heart Association's Cardiac Resuscitation Committee chairman, Dr. John P. Meehan.

BEING TAUGHT to physicians primarily, the class will be held at 8 p.m. "The massage is a useful means of assisting the circulation during cardiac arrest or fibrillation outside the operating room, or where the open chest method would be difficult to carry out," said Dr. Meehan.

The program, directed at restarting stopped hearts without opening the victim's chest, is well underway in the county. More than 1250 physicians in the county have received training in the new method to date, according to Dr. Meehan.

THE NEW massage method was developed by the Johns Hopkins Hospital team of William B. Kouwenhoven, Dr. Ing. James Jude, M.D., and Guy Knickerbocker, M.S.E.

Paul H. Lorhan, M.D., chairman of LACHA's Education Committee will conduct the course at Harbor General Hospital. More information may be obtained from the Los Angeles County Heart Assn., 2405 W. 8th St.

Stock Trade Offered by Banking Firm
