

Cerebral Palsy Backers Seeking 150 Volunteers

More than 150 volunteers will be sought in Torrance for the coming United Cerebral Palsy Assn. appeal, Mrs. Dan Brown, 26021 Matfield Dr., reported today.

Needed for the UCP's residential appeal beginning May 16th, volunteers are to call on neighbors to ask for support of the organization's fight against cerebral palsy, explains Mrs. Brown, who is chairman for Torrance.

"Please, if you can give a few minutes of spare time, call us," Mrs. Brown urges. "Success of the campaign depends on volunteer aid, and the handicapped are looking to us for help."

An estimated 17,000 children and adults in Los Angeles County have cerebral palsy, a condition caused by damage to motor areas of the brain. The UCP maintains five pre-school nurseries, four development centers, industrial training programs, and extensive counseling services within the county. There is a UCP nursery at 4031 Wilton St., Long Beach.

Already enrolled for the drive here are several neighborhood leaders, who are in return recruiting other volunteers to assist in the door to door drive.


