Pittsburgh Net Drops to Fourth Of 1960 Figure

Preliminary figures indicate that Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co.'s earnings in the first quarter will be slightly higher than \$3,000,000 as compared with earnings of \$2,000,000 for the comparable period of 1960.

President David G. Hill told shareholders at the annual meeting here today that sales during the period were approximately \$128,000,000. During the first quarter of 1960, the company reported sales of \$158,000,000.

Hill stated that the recession has been deep and has adversely affected operations to a varying degree in most divisions. He said that the effect has been particularly pronounced in the glass division.

On the brighter side, the company president reported that by late March orders for certain products showed improvement due to liquidation of existing inventories and demand from increased consumer demand.

Hill declined to make a prediction of sales or profits for the balance of the year. He said, "We believe we are in a recovery trend but the vigor of this trend is not yet apparent."
