Reports presented by Frank Kredel, administrator, and Vernon Walker, treasurer, showed that during eight and one half months the hospital has operated since opening on June 15, 1960, the new institution has admitted 2416 patients, registered 399 births and 29 deaths and the staff has grown to 83 doctors, a gain of 11 over the staff when the facility opened.

Gross income for the period has been \$562,103 with expenses of \$463,855, Treasurer Vernon Walker reported. The hospital has paid \$33,544 on debts, another \$25,841 in interest and has set up a \$39,641 operating fund. Net profits since the opening has been 7.628 per cent, Walker reported.
