The Conservative group has chosen to call itself Congregation Ner Tamid of South Bay. An open board meeting has seen the establishment of committees to plan and carry out all of the regular functions of the group. An active Religious School and Hebrew School program with professional educators is being set up for this fall.

There will be religious services for all the major Jewish holidays of the year. In addition, adult education courses and various social events are planned.

Missionaries to Bengal to Speak at Services Tonight

Shirley Hill, who with her husband Glen served as missionaries to Bengal, India, will speak at the 7 p.m. "Missionary Night" service at Calvary Baptist Church, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd., tonight.

Although they have not had specialized medical training, the Hills found that medical needs were so great among the Santals that they had to minister their physical as well as spiritual needs. Shirley aided in childbirths among the women, and Glen gave shots to lepers.

The Hills served for seven years among the Santal tribe of Bengal in the American Baptist Mission. The Santals are an animistic tribe numbering one and one half million people. During their second term among these primitive, tribal people, the Hills' special task was in the field of leadership and Pastoral training. Two of their three children were born in India. The Hills have two boys, aged 15 and 11, and a girl, aged 9. Their field of service covered 1200 square miles.

The 110-year old American Baptist field at Bengal-Orissa is one of several Baptist missions on the Bengal Bay, nicknamed "Baptist Bay". In addition to the American Baptist Mission, the British, Australian Baptists also maintain Missions there. The Baptist work in India was founded by William Carey of England the 18th century, and was supported by the American Baptist, Adoniran Judson, who later established a work in Burma.
