RESOLUTION NO. 61-68  
A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO VACATE EASEMENTS, RIGHTS OF WAY AND OTHER RIGHTS RESERVED AND ACCEPTED FROM THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF THE ALLEY PARALLEL TO AND NORTHWESTERLY OF PALOS VERDES BOULEVARD FROM VIA VALENCIA SOUTHWESTERLY TO THE CITY OF TORRANCE BOUNDARY, IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Torrance on the 11th day of October, 1950, adopted its Resolution No. 4082 declaring its intention, and by Resolution No. 81-27 on the 28th day of March, 1961, ordered the vacation of a portion of the alley parallel to and northwesterly of Palos Verdes Boulevard from Via Valencia Southwesterly to the City of Torrance boundary, within the City of Torrance, more particularly described as follows:

All of Lots 37, 40, and 42 and those portions of Lots 29, 32, 33, 35, 36, 38, 39 and 41, Block "B", Tract No. 10090, as per map recorded in Book 146, Pages 38 to 39, inclusive, of Maps, records of Los Angeles County lying Northwesterly of a line parallel to and distant forty (40) feet Southeastwesterly, measured at right angles, from the Northwesterly line of Lots 29, 32, 33, 35, 37, 40, 41, and 42 of said Block "B", Tract No. 10090; and

WHEREAS, all rights, title and interest of the City to the aforesaid property was vacated by said Resolution No. 4082 and Resolution No. 81-27, with the exception and reservation of certain easements, rights of way and other rights as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, no public use has been made and it is not contemplated that any public use will be made in the foreseeable future of the property rights so excepted and reserved to the City from the vacation of a portion of the alley parallel to and northwesterly of Palos Verdes Boulevard from Via Valencia Southwesterly to the City of Torrance boundary; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that such easements, rights of way and other property rights be vacated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1  
That the City Council hereby declares its intention to vacate the real property hereinafter described as more particularly shown upon a map bearing the legend "Map showing proposed vacation of a portion of the Alley parallel to and northwesterly of Palos Verdes Boulevard from Via Valencia Southwesterly to the City of Torrance boundary, which map is hereby approved for the purpose of this proceeding and is hereby ordered filed in the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance and which map is hereby referred to for particulars as to the proposed vacation.

SECTION 2  
That the property to be vacated pursuant to this resolution is situated in the City of Torrance, County of Los Angeles, State of California, and described as follows:

The City of Torrance reserves and excepts from the vacation an easement and right at any time, or from time to time, to construct, maintain, operate, replace, remove, renew and enlarge lines of cables, wires, poles, and other convenient structures, equipment, and fixtures.

WHEREAS, the operation of telegraphic and telephone lines, the distribution of electric energy, including access to the same, and the use of the property free from inflammable materials and wooded growth, and otherwise in and over the said alley, Northwesterly 3.5 feet of the said alley proposed to be vacated;




