The Torrance Police Department during the first three months of this year investigated a total of 294 accidents as compared to 323 accidents over the same period last year. During the first three and one-half months of this year there have been six persons killed with 189 persons injured in traffic accidents. Last year during this period a total of 152 persons were injured and no persons killed.

Realizing that speed is one of the greater contributors to accidents the Torrance Police cautions all motorists to know and obey all traffic laws.

SPEED ZONE CHANGES — During the last week speed zone changes have been posted on Hawthorne Blvd. between 227th St. to Redondo Beach Blvd. to the following: Posted 50 MPH between Pacific Coast Hwy. and 227th St., 45 MPH.

From 227th St. to 190th St. Between 190th St. to 182nd St. is a posted 40 MPH zone, and a 35 MPH posted zone between 182nd St. and Redondo Beach Blvd.

Explorer 'Hams' Taking to Air With Own Radio System

Explorers, teen-age members of the Boy Scouts of America, have established a radio communications system in the Los Angeles Area Scout Council. It is run by Explorers, but is open to anyone with a ham radio.

Explorers from eight Posts specializing in electronics under the Post specialty plan have their own Gonset short wave transceivers. They have established a central radio station in Mildand District, which is equipped with modern electronic gear.

The central station makes it possible for inter-Post communications which are held every Tuesday at 8:30 p.m. It's supposed to last an hour, but usually goes longer.

THE POSTS send and receive on 145.9 mc.

Anybody with a ham radio set can listen in on the conversations. An international network was established as the Sports, Vacation and Travel Show March 17-26 at the Coliseum. Explorers communicated to all parts of the world via ham radio.

This success story was first made possible by Luther Moell, chairman of the youth services committee of the Aircraft Electrical Society. The AES donated trans-receiver sets to the Council, to be used by Explorer Posts until they were able to build their own sets. Now, all eight electronics Posts are on the air every Tuesday evening, talking with each other.
