

Seator Frost, Widower Cre Run This Week

Western Harness heads into its third full week of racing this week with a five-day program featuring some of the biggest name horses in the country.

Senator Frost, the champion trotter of '59 and victorious in his only two starts at the current 22-day spring meeting, appears in the \$10,000 added Los Angeles Trot on Wednesday and the speedy Widower Creed heads the lineup in the \$10,000 added San Diego Pace on Saturday. He was the "horse of the meeting" at Santa Anita in 1959.

THE STAKES-a day program of Western Harness' outstanding week of racing starts Tuesday with the renewal of the \$4000 added Lakewood Pace.

Miss Demon Abbe, the first horse at the meeting to break 2:00 minutes with her 1:59 1/5 in winning the La Canada purse last week, will make her second start with Jimmy Cruise, owner-trainer-driver, in the sulky.

Miss Demon Abbe is working on a winning streak of four straight, three of them at Roosevelt Raceway last fall.

Miss Demon Abbe is also slated to come back in the \$5000 San Rafael on Friday, and is scheduled to tangle with, among others, Igor Peza's Pacific Pioneer, the "dream horse" trained by Phil Corley. Pacific Pioneer won the first and only start of his life in capturing the second division of the Sierra Madre Pace.

Both Miss Demon Abbe and Pacific Pioneer are by trotting sires, but were changed to pacers when they exhibited a preference for the sidewheeling gait.

THE \$3000 Alhambra on Friday will bring out some Hambletonian eligibles in Harold Blake's Tilden Hanover and the S.A. Camp Farm's Pal Joey and Summer Fun. Both the latter are from the first crop of Scott Frost to come to the races. Scott Frost was a Triple Crown winner in 1955 as well as winning the 1955 and 1956 American Trotting Classics.

Lake Trout Season Opens On April 30

Famed Crowley Lake should produce the best trout fishing in its history when California's late trout season opens on April 30, reports the Department of Fish and Game.

Crowley, located 45 miles north of Bishop, in Mono County, yielded 36½ tons of trout to 21,451 fishermen on the opening week end last year.

Crowley was stocked with 313,000 sub-catchables, weighing less than 2 ounces apiece, last August. DFG checks showed that these little trout stocked in Crowley had grown to from ½ to ¾ of a pound apiece by November, less than four months after they were planted.

In addition to the 313,000 rainbow fingerlings, Crowley Lake was stocked with 245,000 Kamloops rainbow fingerlings, 230,000 cutthroat fingerlings, and 100,000 eastern brook trout fingerlings, or a total planting of 888,000 trout for the 1960 fishing season.

The plant of eastern brook fingerlings is an experimental one to test the suitability of this species to Crowley's conditions.
