Ex-Speaker in Canada's House of Commons to Address Local Group

The Hon. Louis Rene Beaudoin, former Speaker of the House of Commons of Canada, will address the faculty of El Camino College on the future of Canada at 11 a.m., April 7.

The speaker's knowledge in the area of his subject is drawn from personal experience. Elected to the Canadian House of Commons in 1945, Mr. Beaudoin served as Deputy Chairman of the Committees of the Whole House from 1949 to 1951, Deputy Speaker from 1951 to 1953, and Speaker from 1953 to 1957.

BEAUDOIN will make an earlier presentation to the faculty of the social science division on a comparison of the governments of the British Commonwealth and the United States.

His activities in Commonwealth politics include his Presidency of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, chairmanship of the Executive Committee of the Canadian Branch of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, and Delegate to that association to conferences in New Zealand, Australia, Ceylon and London.

FOLLOWING the general meeting, Beaudoin will lunch with El Camino students majoring in the fields of history, political science and economics.

To his political career, Beaudoin has joined a successful record in law and education. He has taught English under a program provided by the government of the Province of Quebec, lectured on political science and the British Parliamentary system to such groups as the United Nations Assn.

and the Canadian Institute on International Affairs.

EDUCATED for the law at the University of Montreal, Beaudoin has since been a member of the Bar of Montreal and Province of Quebec from 1935 to the present. At present he is preparing his thesis for the degree of Doctor in the Science of Jurisprudence and is in candidacy at Columbia University.

So active and varied a career has brought Beaudoin the title of "Honourable." This followed his appointment in 1952 as Queen's Counselor by appointment of the Government of Quebec in 1952 and his appointment to Her Majesty's Canadian Privy Council in 1957.

Arrangements for Beaudoin's visit were made by Dr. William H. Harless, director of instruction, and John de la Hays, assistant director of instruction.

High School Journalists' 'Day in the Navy' Slated

The fourth annual "Day in the Navy" for high school journalists will be staged April 13-14.

More than 400 students from schools in Los Angeles, Orange, Ventura, San Bernardino, and Riverside Counties are expected to take part. They will be accompanied by their journalism advisors and other school authorities.

THE PROGRAM will begin at noon April 13 with registration at the Long Beach Naval Base, followed by a tour of its facilities and movies that night. The aspiring reporters will sleep in a barracks and go aboard the Thetis Bay, an amphibious assault carrier (LPH 6) at 6 a.m., April 14.

The Thetis Bay was the first escort aircraft carrier converted for the purpose of exclusively carrying Marines ashore by helicopter. Her successful pioneering in the use of vertical envelopment tactics has led the Navy to utilize two larger carriers, the Boxer and the Princeton, for such missions.

DURING THEIR 10 hours at

sea the young journalists will see many typical naval activities, including simulated attacks by a submarine and aircraft, as well as launching of helicopters with combat-ready Marines. Accompanying destroyers will be refueled under way also.

Sponsor of "A Day in the Navy" is Public Relations Company 11-2, Naval Reserve, Los Angeles, which originated the program that has been widely copied throughout the nation. City and county boards of education, as well as parochial school officials and the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, are cooperating in the project.

IN ADDITION, the program has the support of the Los Angeles Newspaper Publishers Assn. as a step in the training of reporters because the students will be instructed how to cover news aboard ship and get it ashore for publication.

Authors of the best stories written about the cruise for high school newspapers will be given prizes and the school scoring the most points will receive a special trophy.


