South Bay Hospital Nears Completion Date Schedule

South Bay Hospital construction is nine-tenths completed, according to T. C. Harwick, architect and hospital district representative at the Redondo Beach construction site.

He said work is "on schedule" and will be done in time for the July dedication. Activity by joint contractors M. J. Brack and Sons Inc. and R. J. Daum Construction Co., both of Los Angeles, during the month saw completion of all plastering on the 150-bed 4-story structure.

TERRAZO floor and tile work in surgical and laboratory areas also was finished during the past month. Progress on millwork, parking area paving, electrical, plumbing and heating installation and painting has advanced to the "almost done" point. A progress payment of \$107,137 recently was paid to the contractors by the South Bay Hospital District Board of Directors at a recent meeting. Total cost of the building will be about \$2,970,000, marking a total paid thus far of \$2,149,697.

HARWICK SAID the construction schedule allows for completion of the first three floors by the first of May, with completion of the fourth floor by the end of May. The schedule allows for testing and adjustment of equipment, inspections, and cleaning up of odds and ends for June.

A dedication has been set for the month following. It will be on hospital grounds at N. Prospect Ave. and Diamond St.

TOTAL COST for putting the hospital into operation has been set at \$3 1/2 million. Funds have come from state and federal sources and from a \$1 1/2 million bond issue passed by voters in the three beach cities in 1956.
