35th Birthday Fete Hailed at Great Western

'Government No Longer Remote' Industrialist Tells Local GOP

"We must know why we're Republicans. What we don't know can kill us in 1960 unless we show some action as individuals." Howard Jarvis, president of the Republican Assembly told a luncheon meeting of 42 Torrance area civic leaders Monday.

Jarvis, retired industrialist devoting full time to the Republican cause, was introduced by A. E. "Tommy" Thompson, prominent Torrance civic leader who serves as co-chairman of the Republican Association membership meeting with Martin M. Denn, Hermosa Beach engineering company executive.

"Government once was remote but that is not the case today" Jarvis said. "For the rest of our lifetime it is not going to be the educator or the businessman who runs the country but the politicians. They'll make all the decisions including the wrong ones that might turn you into an atomic bomb cinder."

"I concur with Raymond A. Moley, member of President

Franklin D. Roosevelt's first brain trust and now publisher of Newsweek who said recently: 'In the next eight months it will be decided whether Americans are fit to be free or not.'"


THE SPEAKER reminded his listeners that with only 6 per cent of the population United States is going to have to show the way to freedom to the rest of the world. He sounded a warning to apathetic citizens that organized minorities "are gobbling up everything in the way of our freedoms."

Jarvis also predicted Adlai Stevenson would be the nominee of the Democrats, recalling that the twice-defeated Stevenson got 27 per cent of the total popular vote in 1956, which was more than any defeated candidate had received in history.

While admitting the Republicans probably would be defeated if the election was held "tomorrow," Jarvis asserted the party had cause for great optimism in the Nixon candidacy.
