Torrance's Parnelli Jones Top Young Race Driver in Country

Latest speedster to enter the 100 lap NASCAR Pacific Coast Championship new car race slated for Ascot Stadium, Sunday night, May 1st, is young Parnelli Jones of Torrance.

The twenty five year old Jones has been tabbed by racing fans and sports writ-

ers as the most promising young driver in the country today, by virtue of his ability to drive all types of racing cars with equal skill and success. He is a top competitor in midgets, big cars and the late model stocks.

Parnelli, who has been compared to the new famous

Troy Ruffman, has turned down several offers to drive in the Indianapolis 500 in order to gain more experience, even though he has been on the speedways for more than six years and has been in top competition most of that time.

Last season Jones cam-

paigned on the IMCA speedway car circuit, finishing 5th in the '59 championship standings, and captured the 500 lap NASCAR Memorial Day race at Ascot and numerous other NASCAR and CRA sprint car wins on the Pacific Coast.

In February he competed in

the 500 mile sweepstakes at Daytona Beach, Florida, qualifying at a speed of 136.384 mph in a 1960 Ford.

One of Parnelli's greatest supporters and the owner of his stock car is Vel Miletich, Torrance Ford dealer, who will head his pit crew at the Ascot 100 lap championship
