Graf Spee Film Slated For Showing

"The Pursuit of the Graf Spee," a film chronicling one of the most dramatic engagements in the history of naval warfare, will be shown at Torrance on April 29.

Screenings of the documentary movie are scheduled for 7 and 8:45 p.m. in the council chambers of City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd., under auspices of the Torrance Recreation Dept. and the Los Angeles County Museum.

Admission is free.

The film depicts the pursuit of the Nazi pocket-battleship into the harbor of Montevideo, Uruguay, by units of the British Navy in December, 1939.

Trapped by the Royal Navy and facing internment of the warship by the neutral Uruguayan government, the Graf Spee's skipper ordered her sunk in the mud of the River Plata and then took his own life.
