
Lundy Signs for 2

Blue Check Hen Wins 330 Mile Pigeon Race

The Harbor Pigeon Club released their racing birds from Marysville this morning, some 408 miles away, and the pigeons are expected to arrive sometime early this afternoon.

Last Sunday, Jim Chapman's Blue Check Hen checked in at a winning speed of 1266.65 yards per minute to nip two others at the wire in a 330 mile race from Stockton.

Chapman's hen was on the wing for seven hours, 40 minutes and averaged better than 43 miles per hour.

Fishing Flashes

Tom Perazzo, of 1856 West 222nd St., Torrance, was a jackpot winner recently on board the sportfisher "City of Redondo," when he caught a 4-pound barracuda.

A steady run on barracuda is expected to keep fishermen in Redondo Beach ocean waters busy during the weekend, skippers of three Redondo Beach based sportfishers said.

Passengers on boats in mid-week ran into 5 or 6 acres of barracuda not far off the Hermosa Beach shoreline. Best fishing, however, has been in waters between Redondo and Ocean Park, to the north, skippers said. This marks a shift north in the fishing scene from otherwise popular Rocky Point, south of Redondo.

Jigs and anchovy seem to be doing the trick on barracuda, with 169 passengers on Wednesday (April 20) hauling in 235.

ANGLERS: LEAVE THE HOOK IN UNDERSIZE FISH
