Show Opens On Tuesday

Prices have been scaled to suit every purse — \$2, \$2.50, \$3, \$3.50, and \$4, including tax. Tickets for children 13 and under are half price at any of the evening performances Mondays through Thursdays, with the exception of opening night.

The Sports Arena is in a convenient location for patrons from all parts of Los Angeles and Orange Counties. Situated just off the Harbor Freeway, on South Figueroa at Santa Barbara Avenue in Exposition Park, it may be easily and speedily reached via freeway.

FLYING FISH NOW ALL JET

For the first time in history an inter-continental shipment of trout eggs will make the entire trip by jet airplane. One hundred thousand California rainbow trout eggs from the Department of Fish and Game's Mt. Whitney Hatchery were shipped to Brazil this month. The eggs, packed in ice, were flown from Los Angeles to New York and from New York to Rio de Janeiro by jet airliner.

In return for the trout eggs, Brazil has offered to make available to California several species of Brazilian fish which may be capable of sustaining themselves in California's inland and ocean waters.

TOPPING THE list of NASCAR new car speedsters are three champion drivers; Marvin Porter, Lakewood, National Short Track Champion; Bob Ross, also of Lakewood, Pacific Coast Champion; and Scotty Cain, Santa Monica, P.R.A. Champion.

Some seven entrants will open at 5:30 p.m. with 10,000 pilot brand new 1960 model

autos. They are Parnelli Jones, Torrance; Jim Blomgren, Norwalk; Bill Hardesty and Ron Hornaday of San Fernando; Danny Weinberg, Downey; Charley Chapman, Compton, and Jim Cook, Norwalk.
