Billy Williams Hits .393 For Torrance Hi

Torrance High Shortstop Billy Williams went hitless in his team's baseball finale Thursday against Aviation but wound up the season with a hefty .393 percentage to win the city's mythical batting championship.

Williams, a two year veteran senior, had 22 hits in 56 times at bat while playing in 20 games.

First baseman Joe Austin, a junior from South High, is second on the list with a .378 percentage (28 for 74) while Torrance first baseman Jim Armstrong was third at .357.

Frank Van Patten, North High's southpaw swinging centerfielder, topped his Bay

League co-championship team with a respectable .323 mark. In all, eight players from the city's three high schools batted over the .300 standard: three seniors, four juniors, and a sophomore, Erv Palica of Torrance.

The local preps completed their league seasons last week. North Torrance is scheduled to enter the CIF playoffs this week.


