WAITRESS STARTS ORDINARY DAY, WINDS UP FLOATING ON CLOUD 9

James Lazzaro was eating breakfast Thursday morning at Jody's drive-in restaurant on Hawthorne Ave. when he heard a waitress say "This is my lucky day. What else good can happen to me?"

Later when the waitress, who is Helen Weinberg, stopped at Lazzaro's booth he asked her what made this her lucky day. Helen then showed him a plaque bearing the inscription "To Helen, one of the World's few great waitresses."

Helen went on to explain that 10 members of the National Life Insurance staff had presented her with the plaque that morning. These local businessmen had been eating there regularly and thought they would do something "nice for me because they liked the way I had been serving them."

"I ALSO WILL do something nice for you if you will come over to the Broadway Del Amo Friday afternoon to the beauty salon," Lazzaro told the waitress and added, "I will make you the World's most beautiful waitress."

After Lazzaro had identified himself as the guest hair stylist for the Broadway stores he agreed to style Helen's hair with the compliments of the Broadway-Hale company — "just because you are such a nice person."

"HAIR STYLING begins with

a basic haircut that is just as important to the end result as the foundation is to a house," Lazzaro pointed out while Helen was under a dryer following her shampoo.

He has been one of the leading hair stylists and consultants in the United States since 1939 and although he spends a week assisting customers with their hair problems at each of the Broadway stores in Southern California, and then continues the circuit, he still finds time to lecture to school-age groups on both a career guidance program and what he deems the all important

care of the hair for teen age girls.

AS LAZZARO combed and modeled Helen's hair he talked of many of his interests including the Mexican game of Jai Ali, and told of the games he had played with Cecile, master of the world's fastest competitive game, who has since retired and returned to Spain.

The artist styled his subject's hair with an effect that only a gentle breeze, and James Lazzaro, could have accomplished — without a trace of the artificial — and when he finished Helen Weinberg was truly beautiful.
