Cerebral Palsy Campaign Hits Peak in May Health Officer Says

May is the month in which thousands of volunteers across the country solicit funds from house to house for the United Cerebral Palsy Association. These funds are used to provide opportunities and to make

life a little more livable for a very unfortunate group of children, estimated to number about 250,000, who happen to be afflicted with cerebral palsy.

Cerebral palsy is not a single disease in the usual sense of the word. It includes a variety

of conditions in which there has been brain damage resulting in physical or muscular disability. For example, spastic paralysis is a form of cerebral palsy in which stiffness of the muscles is the most prominent feature. In addition to this stiffness there is difficulty in controlling the muscles.

and balance is the most conspicuous sign. The great majority of cases of cerebral palsy are not recognized with certainty until after six months of age.

Most of the time a child with cerebral palsy has other handicaps besides the lack of control of body movements. He may have convulsions, trouble in speaking, seeing or hearing. The muscles of his face may twist, and along with this, he may droop almost constantly.

These are the signs which have led to the belief that all of these unfortunate children are mentally retarded. This is not true. Some of them are very bright. Some, it is true are retarded mentally in greater or lesser degree.

THE CAUSES of cerebral palsy are not fully understood. Even before birth, some part of the brain may not grow or develop as it should. Some cases are attributed to brain damage during hard labor at birth, and other cases have developed after severe cases of whooping cough, measles, and meningitis. Head injuries have been responsible for others.

The handling of most cerebral palsied children is indeed difficult and usually expensive. In many cases it is necessary that they have special care and training, sometimes

in institutions.

SPECIALLY trained teachers and medical personnel are needed in many cases. Because few parents can afford the expense of caring for a severely afflicted child, voluntary and public funds are a necessity if these children are to be cared for properly.
