State Meet Next for Tartars

Tartars Qualify For State Prep Track Finals

Miler Mike Thornton and high jumper Gary Huffman from Torrance High School qualified for the 42nd California state prep track and field meet to be held at Stanford University in Palo Alto Saturday by placing second in their respective specialties at the CIF (Southern Section) championships last week in Long Beach.

The Tartar duo and Joe Sarthou, their coach, will make the trip north by school car, leaving the city tomorrow morning. They expect to arrive sometime late Friday afternoon and will meet the cream of the state's track and field crop Saturday morning.

THE BEST FROM the Los Angeles City, and CIF northern and southern sections will be competing in 12 events, with the prelims set Saturday morning and the finals in the afternoon.

At the sectional championships last week at Memorial Stadium, Long Beach, Huffman, a loose-legged senior, cleared the high bar at 6'4 1/2" to tie for second and win his medal. It was his best jump of the year.

Gary placed second in the Pioneer League finals with a jump of 6'1".

He tried 6-5 three times Saturday, and barely missed it on two of the attempts. The winning height was 6'5 1/4".

THORNTON, the fastest distance runner in the long history of the school, was nosed out for the second time by La Habra's diminutive Bruce Bess in a great mile race that had both runners clocked in under 4:21.

Thornton, holder of the school (4:20.5) and Pioneer League (4:25.6) records was nipped in the last 10 yards by less than six feet by the 15-year-old La Habra sensation who won it in 4:20.5.

The race was a near repeat performance of the Huntington Beach Relays early in the season.

IN PALO ALTO Saturday, Bess, Thornton, and Artesia High's Art Gurule from the CIF will be included in a field of 12 which features four northern California milers

whose bests are under 4:20.

They are topped by Berkeley High's Harry McCalla, 4:16.1. Last year six runners went under 4:20 in the state meet.

Six of the runners in Saturday's race—which could be the biggest prep mile duel of the decade—are among the nation's top 10 for that event.

In the high jump, Huffman will have his work cut out for him, with every entrant having already cleared at least 6'4". The tops in the state, however, is 6'6".

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA team title contenders are LA Jordan, Compton, Manual Arts, and Fontana.

Northern California's top teams are San Francisco Poly, Berkeley, and San Mateo.

Berkeley has three of the state's best in the shot put (60'11 1/2"), mile (4:16.1), and the low hurdles (18.9).

Torrance Angler Sacks 370 Lb. Black Sea Bass in San Diego

SAN DIEGO—In addition to winning an eighth place prize in the \$25,000 San Diego Yellowtail Derby, Charles Davis of Torrance made the most of his time last weekend by sacking a 370 pound black sea bass.

Davis' prize catch was the biggest of nearly 2000 fish landed by 150 anglers off the Coronado Islands in the first major fishoff of the derby.

HIS EIGHTH place loot for landing the eighth biggest yellow—a 19 pound, 13 ounce while fishing off the "Fastest"—was a rod and reel.

Fishoff winner was E. W. Kurlle of Glendale, who took home keys to a new Chevrolet station wagon. He landed a 22 pound, nine ounce yellow from Wayne Miller's "Captain Midnight" to take title to the car.

With the first major fishoff behind them, deep sea anglers again were storming the Coronados this week with a three-

fold purpose—to take advantage of another heavy run of big yellows in that area, to bag a qualifying fish in the second derby period, and to crack the Bonanza cash jackpot now swelling over the \$2000 mark.

BESIDES Kurlle and Davis, other yellowtail fishoff winners were Kobo Fukutaki of Los Angeles, 20 pounds, 10 ounces; Del Moore, San Diego, 21-4; Pete Maheras, San Diego, 21-1; Kaz Minami, of Gardena, 20-4; Joseph Porter, Buena Park, 20-3; Rex Thexton, Alhambra, 19-15; and George Constantino, Banning, 19-11.

The derby's biggest fish so far is a 27 pound 8 ounce yellow sacked by Fred Bunge of Alhambra.

HAS GOAT FOR COMPANION 'Looney' Mare Favored In Hollypark Feature

A light-footed mare who has a goat for a companion and who is described by her trainer as "just plain looney" may be the heroine of Hollywood Park's Hollywood Express, the five and a half furlong stakes that will top this week of racing on Saturday.

The female speed burner who will be seeking her seventh straight victory when she goes against the men horses in the Holly park sprint feature is Liberal Lady, an Irish-bred importation from England who is owned by the popular Floridians, Mr. and Mrs. Tilyou

Christopher of Miami. **OFF HER** sensational three-length victory in the recent Sequoia Stakes at Hollywood Park, it is likely that Liberal Lady, who may run coupled with another fast Christopher horse, Captain Kidd II, will be the favorite in the Hollywood Express.

The Sequoia was the most sensational race of Liberal Lady's career. She ran the fastest first quarter in Holly park history—21 2/5 seconds—and then equalled Alhambra's half-mile of 43 4/5 clocking for six furlongs. This was only a tick off Fleet Nasrullah's track record of 1:08 1/5.

While Liberal Lady currently is in the most sensational form of her life she has had troubles reaching the top.

PURCHASED for a fancy price—\$35,000 and \$40,000—by the Harbor View Stable from the Irish Bloodstock Agency, Liberal Lady was brought over from England in February, 1958.


She was turned back by Harbor View because of the feared loss of an eye. Tilyou Christopher bought her for half the original asking price.

While she had a good record in England as a two-year old it was not until September of '58 at Atlantic City that Liberal Lady won her first race in this country.

"**THEY SAY** Amerigo in our barn is a nutty horse because he has to be saddled away from the regular paddock, but he's just rough and playful. Liberal Lady was, and still can be, just plain looney.

"But between Barbara and Lollypops, the goat who stays in her stall, Liberal Lady has settled down.

"I just hope she runs as well in the Hollywood Express as she did in the Sequoia. They won't catch her if she does. She's always been a terrifically fast mare, setting a Florida track record of 1:08 3/5 as a three-year-old in December of '58," he says.
