Marsden, who is playing summer ball on Torrance's Connie Mack League entry, was a solid all-Bay League selection recently after hitting at a .311 clip for 25 season games and sparking the North High nine to a three-way tie for the title.

DAVE, a 6-FOOT, 180-pounder, became the first baseballer from North in the school's five-year history to make an all-CIF (Southern Section) berth.

He was one of two players from the Bay League to be recognized by the Helms Board of Athletics, which is made up of 20 men, including 18 sportswriters from prominent southland newspapers.

Joey Moeller, a 6'4" right-hander from Mira Costa was a first-string pitching selection. Joey was also all-CIF in basketball.

MOELLER HAD an 11-4 record with the Mustangs.

Marshall Adair—selected as the "AAA" division player of the year—was the only 11th grader to make the first team. The 5'10", 165 pounder is regarded as the finest all-around

athlete in El Rancho High history. Adair was on the all-CIF football team last fall.

He hit 10 home runs during the year and threw out 32 men on the basepaths.

The all-CIF players will compete Saturday against the all-City baseballers in their annual game Hearst Sandlot classic at Wrigley Field.

Twenty-four "AAA" Division schools are represented on the 1960 Helms Board teams. Six schools put two players on the three teams.

FOUR OTHER junior players were named on this season's All-C.I.F. teams along with Player of the Year Adair.

Four players who were named to the All-CIF "AAA" team in 1959, find themselves on the all-star teams again in 1960. However, no players repeated on the first team.

As is often the case with high school baseball, there was an over abundance of fine pitching talent for the Board to choose from so much so, that several outstanding pitchers were named to outfield positions where they performed when not on the mound.

ALONG WITH the usual player awards, which will be Jack Mele of Whittier High School will receive a special coach award for his outstanding efforts in directing his high school team to the central "AAA" Division CIF Baseball Championship for 1960.
