

Single Auto Crashes High On CHP List

Single car crashes in which the automobile ran off the roadway and overturned or struck some other object ac-

counted for 28.4 per cent of all fatal traffic accidents in California last year, reports the California Highway Patrol. Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden said there were 871 single car accidents in which 983 persons were killed.

One-fourth of them occurred during the three-hour period from 1 a.m. until 4 a.m. "Four out of five of these accidents happened outside of cities and were investigated by the California Highway Patrol," Crittenden continued. "The information we gathered indicates one or more of three factors — too much speed, drinking, and sleepiness — contributed to almost all of them. "This is definitely a kind of accident that the individual motorist can prevent. The answer lies in reducing speed not only within the legal limit but also to the speed at which the driver can keep his car under control. In addition, no person should continue to drive when his reflexes are slowed by too much alcoholic beverage or just normal sleepiness."

A former Harbor Area campaign chairman, he will also represent Harbor Cities on the Los Angeles Area board of directors of the Community Chest.



Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. Fullmoon, a new double yellow hibiscus is available at C.A.N. nurseries. All hibiscus like a mulch to keep roots cool during the hot weather, as well as filtered sun for best show of summer-to-fall color.
2. Raise the blades on your lawn mower as taller grass won't be scorched as readily by the hot summer sun. Follow a regular watering, feeding and weeding schedule to keep lawn green and vigorous throughout this season.
3. Prune shrubs that bloomed in spring, such as: weigela, spiraea, forsythia and philadelphus. Thin and cut back branches to help along new flowering wood.
4. Blooming fuchsias are ready at C.A.N. nurseries for you to set in the ground, or grow in containers for the patio, or in hanging baskets. Keep fuchsias well-watered. Occasionally, it's a good idea to submerge the entire pot in a pan of water during hottest weather to saturate the root ball.
5. With blue hydrangeas, the C.A.N. suggests generally a monthly application of aluminum sulfate (1/4 ounce dissolved in a gallon of water) to heighten blueness in blue varieties. What cooler sight or a summer's day than hydrangea with its massive blue blooms thriving in a shady site?
