

Five Area Teenagers Attending Junior Red Cross Training Camp

Five Torrance teenagers are among some 200 high school students who attended the first session of the Junior Red Cross Leadership Training Center, Camp Seeley, in the San Bernardino mountains, this week.

ior Red Cross chairman, announces that the local students left Los Angeles by chartered bus for Camp Seeley.

"There will be four camp sessions between June 26 and July 15, with a total of 700 junior and senior high school

students attending," explained Mrs. Mangan.

DELEGATES TO Camp Seeley are chosen by their school administrators and faculties on the basis of scholarship and potential leadership.

"Camp Seeley is sponsored by Junior Red Cross in cooperation with the various boards of education," said Mrs. Mangan.

"Their five-day stay includes leisure, recreational and cultural activities along with instruction and orientation in all

phases of Red Cross community activity."

MRS. MANGAN stated that there is no charge for attendance at Camp Seeley. When the boys and girls return to their class in the fall, they are ready to help organize and lead their own Junior Red Cross activities.

Class instruction is provided by teachers from local boards of education as well as Red Cross staff members. Counselors are trained college students assigned to recreational projects.
