

National Guard Commander In Retirement

Maj. Gen. Homer O. Eaton Jr., commander of Southern California's largest reserve force, the 40th Armored Division, California Army National Guard, retired from the guard on Saturday, Maj. Gen. Earle M. Jones, state adjutant general, said today.

Gen. Jones said Gen. Eaton's retirement is mandatory under the provisions of the Reserve Officers Personnel Act of 1954 which became effective in the National Guard on July 1. His retirement closes a military career of almost 40 years with more than 35 years of commissioned service.

Gen. Jones announced that Brig. Gen. Charles A. Ott Jr., 1929 East Las Tunas Road, Santa Barbara, has been appointed to succeed Gen. Eaton. He has been assistant division commander for the past year.

Young Pianist Acclaimed By South Bayans

Jimmy Howard took his first step down a road named success when the nine-year-old pianist appeared in the Torrance-South Bay Concert last month.

The young musician had played in many recitals, but this was his first concert. That he was deemed a success was proved by music lovers who attended and acclaimed his ability and talent.

What followed left no doubt that he would go far in his field for he received the Jose Drudis Foundation scholarship for artists and painters. The award was recommended by Mrs. Earl Carson, of the Hollywood Bowl committee for outstanding ability in the allied arts and the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Howard, of 16514 Purche, will have \$50 per month to further his musical studies for as long as he needs financial help. He also was presented a grand piano along with the Jimmy Howard Scholarship, as it is now known.

Jimmy Howard, in the fourth grade at Lincoln Elementary school, is interested only in classical music. His favorite composer is Beethoven and he hopes to some day study in Europe.

His teacher, Josephine Heintz Gerity, a Philharmonic lecturer, said he took his first step as a concert pianist like a seasoned trooper and that he was not primed for this one concert. She thinks Jimmy will study in Europe and one day may play with the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra.

Music runs in Jimmy Howard's family as his grandmother is Eleanor Royall Sleeth and his great uncle and aunt are Mr. and Mrs. Bob Sleeth, of Torrance.
