Harbor College Sets Dates for Entrance Tests

"The entrance tests required of everyone who intends to enroll as a regular day student for the coming fall semester at Harbor College will be given only eight dates between now and September 3." William H. McMasters, Dean of Admissions and Guidance, explained today.

"We are unable to give the tests after September 3 because of increasing enrollments and the impossibility of processing late examinations between September 13, the last registration date for day students," McMasters said.

THE ENTRANCE guidance examination consists of a series of tests covering general college ability and takes approximately 3 1/2 hours to complete. No preparation is required, and the results are discussed during the guidance interview, which is arranged by the applicant with a counselor.

The individual interviews emphasize vocational counseling, indicate current trends in various occupations, and provide additional information through the college occupational library.

THE ENTRANCE test schedule is as follows: Monday, July 11, 1 p.m.; Wednesday, July 20, 6 p.m.; Tuesday, July 26, 8:30 a.m.; Friday, Aug. 5, 1 p.m.; Saturday, Aug. 13, 9 a.m.; Friday, Aug. 19, 8:30 a.m.; Monday, Aug. 29, 6 p.m.; and Saturday, Sept. 3, 9 a.m.

Anyone who wishes to take the tests should call the college admissions office at TE 4-8581 for specific appointment for one of these dates, McMasters said.

Veterans attending evening college on the veterans' bills, as well as all regular day students, are required to take the examinations.

Distribution Sales Tax Announced

The 54 counties and 333 cities that contracted for State collection of their local sales and use taxes before January 1, 1960, have received the final second-quarter distribution of receipts on January-March taxable transactions, it was announced today by Richard Nevins, Fourth District Member of the State Board of Equalization. The \$51,254,880 distributed in May and June brought allocations for the fiscal year to \$218,971,294, with slightly over three-fourths of this amount going to cities and the remainder going to counties including the consolidated

City and County of San Francisco. Taxable business in the 246 cities and 48 counties receiving allocations for at least eight quarters was 13 1/2 per cent higher in the past fiscal year than in the 1958-59 fiscal year. Almost one-fourth of these jurisdictions experienced gains in excess of 20 per cent. Only 24 local governments experienced a decline in allocations from those of the preceding fiscal year. Total sales tax revenue distributed to Los Angeles County amounted to \$1,775,563 during the quarter, bringing the

total for the fiscal year to \$9,429,544. These receipts are one-tenth of one per cent less than those for the 1958-59 fiscal year. Torrance received \$248,267 during the second quarter, bringing the current total to \$1,013,521, an increase of 44.7 per cent over the 1959 fiscal year.
