Torrance Group Attends Meet At Los Angeles

Members of the Torrance congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses returned this week from the Peace-Pursuing Assembly at Wrigley Field Los Angeles where they heard instructive discourses by 36 ministers. Included in the bi-lingual assembly were seven Spanish speaking ministers, all representing the Watchtower Bible Society of New York.

According to Leonard Olliff, presiding minister of the local congregation, 777 persons were baptized on Saturday after hearing a discourse on Baptism by R. D. Cantwell, Los Angeles Circuit Minister.

Before a packed out audience of 36,485, Bruce E. Griffin from the Brooklyn headquarters mounted the flower-decked platform to deliver the long awaited and widely advertised talk, "Security During War of the Great Day of God the Almighty." Amid repeated applause, Mr. Griffin forcefully reminded his audience "only God himself can tell us what security measures will be adequate. This He has done and is doing through His Witnesses. The place of security is on the side of Almighty God and of His Christ and under their protection. It is therefore necessary to seek the established Kingdom of God and His Christ, because only under it can we be among the survivors of the War of the Great Day of God the Almighty."

Mr. Olliff stated, "The many instructions received and new things learned at the assembly will be put to use in the local congregation and will be certain to improve the quality of our ministry."

Principals Hear Noted Educator

A good social studies program should emphasize understanding of subject matter, student attitudes, and development of study skills, Dr. John Jarolimek, noted educator, told Torrance principals at a meeting Friday.

Head of the elementary education program at San Diego State College, Dr. Jarolimek came to Torrance as a consultant in improving the social studies program. He is the author of a number of books and articles about social studies. He also is a former principal in Minnesota and Wisconsin.

He urged the principals to make sure that social studies teaching involves more than memorizing names, dates, and facts which are not always meaningful. Social studies also should help to develop good study habits, critical thinking, and good attitudes, he said.

"A balanced social studies program is the best king," he said.

Pastor Home From Studies

The Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita will hear the pastor, Robert A. Wells, at both the 8:30 and 10:50 services this Sunday morning. Mr. Wells has spent the past two months in further graduate study at Southwest Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas.

The Sunday morning message will be "What Are You Living For?" The pastor will state "Many people cannot honestly say why they want to continue to live. Others only vaguely feel it is to earn enough to meet the bills and keep the family going; there is a small minority who really can give a purpose that is upmost in their lives."

The congregation will conduct a one week Summer Crusade for Christ July 24-31. The guest preacher will be the Rev. Blake Woolbright. Mr. Woolbright is pastor of the Bristol Street Baptist Church of Santa Ana.
