



Harold Frenz Will Head 1960 Community Chest Fund Drive

Harold G. Frenz is going after another 100 per cent Torrance Community Chest campaign this year.

Jim Becker, Harbor Area Community Chest chairman, announced this week that Frenz, who headed last year's successful drive, has again accepted the top post of the Torrance appeal. Only Gardena and Harbor City-Lomita joined Torrance in the 100 per cent class last year.

ASSOCIATED with the Bank of America for 22 years, Frenz has been Torrance branch manager for the past three years. He is a member of the American Institute of Banking and of the Alumni Association of the Pacific Coast Graduate School of Banking.

He is a member of the Torrance Kiwanis Club, the Executive Dinner Club, Torrance Area, and a director of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce.

TORRANCE, largest of all Harbor Area communities included in the Los Angeles Area Community Chest, will need 1367 volunteer workers, according to Frenz. Enrollment of these volunteers is now underway and persons interested may call him, FA 8-7370.

Other officers include: Marshall Rosen, of Westchester Post 617, the immediate Past Commander of the Los Angeles District Council, will serve as Chief of Staff;


Hym an Manber of San Bruno, a Past Commander of Peninsula Post 688, will be Northern Area Chief of Staff;
