### Date Bread, Pork Chops Tops with Bayliff Clan

Mrs. W. H. Bayliff, 3214 W. 179th St. not only gets the nod from her family and friends, but she wins a big "bravo" from Torrance Herald staff members with her "Date Nut Bread" one of the recipes she chose for today's Favorite Recipe column.

Mr. and Mrs. Bayliff and their family have lived in California for the past 18 years, coming from Kingman, Ariz. They have been in Torrance for 4 1/2 years, living the 10 previous years in Hawthorne. Their family consists of three daughters, Becky, 17, Donna, 16, and Edna Marie, 5. Becky was graduated this year from North High and is enrolled in the Flavio Beauty college here. Donna will be a junior next year and Edna Marie will begin first grade at Hamilton school.

Mr. Bayliff is a Navy veteran of World War II and has been employed at North American Aviation for 18 years in various supervisory positions.

Mrs. Bayliff is a past president of York Elementary PTA in Hawthorne, junior past president of North High PTA, and will serve as 1960-61 president of Hamilton PTA. She also holds the position of fourth vice president, Education Dept. of Torrance Council PTA.

When asked for her two favorite recipes, Mrs. Bayliff chose the Date Nut Bread (which she made for the staff) and her Baked Pork Chop recipe, which follow.

**Date Nut Bread**

1 egg  
1/4 cup sugar  
1/2 cup dates  
1/2 cup nut meats

4 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 cup milk  
2 cup flour

Beat eggs and add sugar. Add broken nut meats and cut-up dates. Sift dry ingredients together and add alternately with milk to first mixture. Turn into greased loaf pan. Bake about 45 minutes at 350 degrees.

**Baked Pork Chops**

Choose six large loin chops. Dip in beaten egg and fine bread crumbs. Brown quickly in hot skillet; place in baking dish. Slice a small onion over chops. Bell pepper rings are good too. Pour 1 can mushroom soup diluted with water over all. Bake at 300 degrees for 45 minutes.
