Need for More State Recreation Facilities Pointed Up in Summer

is upon us again. The good weather and fine country with which we are blessed leads to Californians taking more outdoor vacations than the residents of other states, and this, combined with the large numbers of out-of-staters coming to California to vacation, is again leading to overcrowding of outdoor facilities.

More than three-quarters of a million persons jammed California State Parks over the Fourth of July weekend, making it the largest attendance in a three-day period for State Parks in California history.

While California's program compares favorably with that of other states, we must accelerate the pace of expansion of present facilities, while at the same time developing and utilizing state holdings in the recreational area to their utmost potential.

THE CHIEF of the Division of Beaches and Parks, Charles A. DeTurk, reported that all parks were overcrowded, with campsites at such a premium that disappointed campers were turned away at all locations which provide these accommodations.

The largest attendance recorded for the holiday period was at Folsom Lake State Park, where more than 30,000 arrived on July 3 and 4. While many Southern Californians stayed close to home, with such sites as Huntington Beach reporting an attendance of 19,000 daily the maximum for this vacation spot, many turned to the Redwoods areas.

AT HUMBOLDT Redwoods State Park, the attendance topped 17,000 on each of the three days, but close to 3000 carloads of wouldbe campers were turned away.

Even Bolsa Chica, newly

opened and still undeveloped, had 23,200 for July 2, 3, and 4.

OBVIOUSLY, the need to expand recreational facilities is becoming acute. One step which will be taken in this direction is a stepped-up program of park development which will be undertaken in the State's 1961-1962 budget.

While California's program compares favorably with that of other states, we must accelerate the pace of expansion of present facilities, while at the same time developing and utilizing state holdings in the recreational area to their utmost potential.

WE CANNOT separate outdoor recreational facilities from our highway program. With Southern Californians often taking advantage of vacation sites in the far north redwood country, our freeway and highway links become of paramount importance to vacationers.

I was particularly interested to note, right here in Los Angeles County, that bids will be opened on Aug. 11 to determine the construction of a fence and cable barrier in the center strip of the Harbor Freeway between 120th Street and 190th Street. I have long argued that this protection against generally fatal cross-over accidents is vitally needed.
