**More Than 900 Teachers Rehired
For Next Year; 83 Given Tenure**

More than 900 Torrance teachers were officially rehired for the 1961-62 school year by Board of Education action Tuesday night, with "tenure" being granted to 83 teachers. Rehired teachers, plus about 150 new instructors will serve the nearly 29,000 children expected in Torrance Schools this fall. The expected increase of about 2000 students will cause hiring of about 55 new teachers. Resignations of 95 teachers were accepted.

The number of Torrance faculty members on tenure will be about half of the total staff, as the result of the board action. "Tenure" means that a teacher has permanent status in the district as long as service is satisfactory.
