as employees grow older and the number increases.

By budget categories, expenditures in the proposed budget are nearly identical with the current budget, Waldrip said. About 85 per cent would go for salaries. Percentages spent in each category include:

INSTRUCTION, 70 per cent; operations, 10.4; fixed charges, 4.7; administration, 3.7; maintenance, 3.5; capital outlay, 2.6; auxiliary services, 2.1; transportation, 1.9; community service, .8; and food service, .2.

Local taxpayers would supply about 59 per cent of the total budget, according to estimates, while state aid would provide about 41 per cent. Federal aid at this point appears negligible because Public Law 874, which provided nearly 2 1/2 per cent of last year's budget, will expire in June. Congress still is debating whether to renew it.

LAST YEAR, local taxes provided about 52 1/2 per cent of the budget, while the state contributed 45 per cent. However, a legal formula set up by the State Legislature, reduces the state proportion as the total amount increases.

The budget anticipates collection of the entire 50-cent override approved by voters last February, meaning a \$2.60 operating tax rate on local property. Assessed valuation of about \$230,000,000 also is estimated.

A TENTATIVE budget will be adopted next month, with final action in August, once assessed valuation totals are known. Final budget figures will depend on assessed valuation and any income from other sources.

The board also received a proposal to increase maximum salaries from the Torrance Educational Assn., teacher organization.
