Army Pvt. Ronald M. Bohannan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Morris Bohannan, 21504 Denker Ave., graduated from the 82nd Airborne Division Jump School at Fort Bragg, N.C., April 28.

Bohannan received his parachutist wings after completing four weeks of intensive ground and aerial training which included five parachute jumps.

The 82nd, a major Strategic Army Corps (STRAC) unit, constantly maintains an immediate readiness force for airborne deployment to any area of the world.

He entered the Army last November and was last stationed at Fort Ord, Calif.

The 18-year-old soldier is a 1960 graduate of Narbonne High School in Lomita.

Marine Pfc. Frank J. Moreno, son of Mrs. Betty Revell of 17727 Atkinson Ave., completed, May 5, four weeks of individual combat training with the Second Infantry Training Regiment at the Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton.

A registration statement covering a public offering of 1,000,000 shares of A Common Stock was filed today with the Securities and Exchange Commission by Harvey Aluminum. The share will be offered by an underwriting group headed by Kuhn, Loeb & Co., Inc. and Tucker, Anthony & R. L. Day. Harvey Aluminum, a producer of primary aluminum and aluminum mill products, was founded in 1914 and became a publicly held company on June 21, 1960.

A REGISTRATION statement disclosed that the company's net sales were \$41,860,000 for the six months ended March 31, 1961, compared with \$28,828,000 reported the same period last year. Net profits after taxes for the 1961 period was \$3,075,000 or 65 cents per share on 4,750,000 shares outstanding, compared with \$2,257,000 or 56 cents per share on the equivalent of 4,000,000 shares outstanding a year earlier. The increase in net profit was 36 per cent.

Proceeds of the issue will be used to assist the company in its program to develop into a fully integrated producer of aluminum and aluminum mill products.

ACCORDING to the registration statements, Harvey has completed negotiations with the U.S. Government for the sale to the company of the aluminum wrought products plant and equipment located at Adrian, Mich. The plant was built for the government during World War II.

When placed in operation, the Adrian plant will substantially increase the company's capacity to produce aluminum mill products. The purchase price is \$3,626,100. The sale of the plant to Harvey Aluminum was announced by President Kennedy at a recent press conference.
