Anderson Elected to Head El Camino's Student Body

After sweeping presidential elections at El Camino College this week, Dan Anderson of Hermosa Beach will serve as president of the Associated Students next semester, Terry Harmon, incumbent vice president announced yesterday.

Run-offs for the office of commissioner of activities between Roger Blewett of Manhattan Beach and John Spilka of Inglewood, and commissioner of rallies between Bill Hughes of Los Angeles and Al Schneider of Hawthorne were staged Friday with announcement of winners slated for the coming week.

IN AN unprecedented display of campaigning, the campus shook with spirit as three political parties waged war for the much-sought office, bringing out a record number of 827 voters, nearly doubling recent voting records.

Backing-up the new president, Bob Kuehn of Torrance captured the vice presidency with campaign running mates Dave Bean, Redondo Beach; Fred Badalamente, Torrance,

and Eddie Wood, Torrance, assuming the offices of commissioner of athletics, freshman president, and sophomore president, respectively.

NEW ASSOCIATED Women Students President will be Ruby Windham, Hawthorne, and secretary of the organization will be Kathy Mufinich, Inglewood, for the coming semester.

The Commissioner of public relations post was copied by John Acord, Torrance. Victorics went to unopposed candidates in elections for the commissioners of assemblies, Maureen Hayes, Hawthorne; finance, Wayne Hren, Manhattan Beach, and publications, Wayne Overbeck, Manhattan Beach.

The Sophomore secretary victory was won by Leilani Ellet, Lawndale, unopposed. Also unopposed was Rel James of Gardena, who won the Associated Men Students' presidency with the vice presidency going to Robert A. Benson of Hawthorne.

Steel Industry Changes Needed, Executive Claims

"Sweeping changes" in the American steel industry are necessary to restore its competitive position throughout the world, Logan T. Johnston, president of Armco Steel Corp., believes.

Addressing the American Iron and Steel Institute in New York City, he declared that opportunities for future success lie in the creation of a truly international industry.

He pointed out that the United States has become a net importer of steel and that export markets for American steel have shrunk alarmingly.

HIGHER LABOR and capital equipment costs in the United States, along with "antique" depreciation provisions and foreign trade barriers, have cut the steel industry's participa-

tion in foreign markets by about 85 per cent in 13 years, he reported.

"It's no secret that some foreign steel products actually surpass their American counterparts in quantity and use in this country," he stated.

JOHNSTON SAID that the demand for steel outside the United States could be 250 million tons higher in the mid-1970's, but that this demand will be met primarily by foreign producers.

"If we are to have a proportionate share of this market, we must get inside it and become a part of it," he declared.

He called for cooperation of United States labor and the government with the steel industry.


