Instead of whipping together the goodies which bakers said would be required for a 4000 pound cake, the May Co., for the 14th consecutive year, divided the ingredients — in their most useful form — among the children of 12 Community Chest agencies.

Not all of the children could be present at the special ceremony in the employees lounge at the May Co. Service Building, Jefferson and Grand.

Samuel J. Sugerman, executive vice president, made the presentation. It was accepted on behalf of the children by Jesse Tapp, chairman of the board, Bank of America, and vice chairman of the Community Chest.

Piled high were the ingredients, awaiting delivery to the agencies. They included 800 pounds of butter, 112 gallons of milk, 120 dozen eggs, 1000 pounds of flour, 1300 pounds

of sugar, 24 pounds of salt, 5 quarts of vanilla, and 50 pounds of baking powder.

### Special Flag Exhibit Open At Museum

A special exhibit commemorating Flag Day on June 14 and Independence Day on July 4 is now open to the public at the Los Angeles County Museum. Titled "Flags in American History," it will continue through July 30.

The display features the 13 star flag of the American Revolution, the 34 star flag of the Civil War period and the new 50 star flag. Also on view is an original document relating to the celebration of the first

Fourth of July in Los Angeles in 1847.

Lent by Santa Monica sculptor Dwight Franklin, the document is a directive signed by

Colonel J. D. Stevenson on July 2, 1847, giving instructions for the first raising of the Stars and Stripes over Los Angeles on July 4 at newly

completed Fort Moore.

The flags have been selected from the Museum's collection, which is one of the largest in the West, comprising more than 100 flags of historic significance.






