ment to Turkey recently, indicated that employees will probably get a five per cent pay hike on top of a readjustment of basic scales to meet the average of comparable cities.

They also indicated that longevity pay probably would be included for most employees (below grade 47) after 5, 12, and 19 years of service.

Final public hearing on the budget has been scheduled for 5:30 p.m. next Tuesday, and adoption must be completed by the following Tuesday, June 27. The budget becomes effective on July 1.

Extradition

Ordered for Riviera Man

A 49-year-old Riviera resident has been ordered to return to Mexico to face charges of embezzling funds from a pipeline company which employed him.

Jaime Merino, who resided at 141 Via Monte D'Oro, was taken into custody after an order Monday that he be extradited to Mexico on the embezzlement charges.

Merino, a petroleum engineer, has been fighting the extradition for more than a year.

Once a district superintendent of Pemex, a Mexican government owned petroleum firm, the Riviera man was sent to this area two years ago to study drilling techniques in the petroleum industry.

Mothers Ask Madison St. Truck Ban

Walteria mothers have banded together to protest the use of Madison St. by trucks from the Torrance Sand and Gravel Co. hauling fill dirt for the San Diego freeway.

The mothers have taken up virgil at the corner of Newton and Madison Sts. with signs proclaiming the heavy truck traffic on the residential street to be a danger to children in area. City councilmen say the law allows the trucks to use the street and that they can do nothing, but the Torrance Police Dept. has placed an officer on duty during working hours.


