

Schools Close, State Vehicle Director Warns Motorists

"Have kids, will travel!" As California schools close for the summer, Robert McCarthy, State Director of Motor Vehicles, says there will be over three-and-a-half million kids in and about millions of California's motor cars as they take off on the highways for the holidays.

"The youngsters feeling their vacation oats can make distracting passengers and tour directors for parents, relatives, and friendly hosts driving them about on the innumerable vacation pursuits in the Golden State," the Director declared in Sacramento yesterday. He admitted he is mindful of his own responsibility in

driving his ten children about on holiday chores from time to time. "Equally important is an alert to watch for kids as pedestrians—playing close to the street, sometimes all too forgetful about the hazard of running into the street. Watch

out for kidstriaans! "California motorists, parental and otherwise, can save lives and help make the good old summer time really memorable by a valiant and effective effort to keep accidents out of the picture. "Let's keep 'em playing all

summer long—with no casualties caused by lapses from the safety standard in our driving. This means cutting down on the speed factor, and stepping up the warning signal alerts for turning, slowing, and stopping. There are no substitutes for these cautions."


