Tularemia Still Claims Victims Throughout State, Officer Says

Chills and fever, sometimes accompanied by complete prostration, are among the first signs of the infection quickly followed by the formation of an ulcer at the original point, or points, of infection. The lymph glands draining the involved area may become enlarged and tender and may abscess. There is no glandular involvement in the gastric form of the disease, although the other symptoms are usually present.

DIAGNOSIS of the disease may be confirmed by laboratory tests, while treatment with certain of the antibiotics is generally highly effective. One attack of the disease affords permanent immunity.

Prevention of tularemia depends upon the precautions each person takes for his own safety. It is certainly inadvisable to handle sick or dead wild animals, or to skin or dress wild game without wearing rubber gloves. All animals whose internal organs are studded with white spots should be buried or burned and the person's hands washed and disinfected. The absence of spots, it is cautioned, does not always indicate that the animal is free of the disease.

ADDITIONAL measures include the thorough cooking of all wild game meat, the avoidance of raw drinking water obtained from streams in areas that may be inhabited by infected animals, and the taking of suitable precautions against insect and tick bites in areas where tularemia is present in the small wildlife population.

SOME 490 CASES of tularemia were reported in California between 1927 and 1959, with 13 deaths. In Los Angeles County during the last 10-year period, 11 cases of the disease have been reported, resulting in 2 deaths. No cases have occurred locally since 1959.

Rats and mice, muskrats, tree squirrels, gophers, beavers and a variety of other wild and domestic animals — including the cat and dog — may be infected with the disease, but the chief source of infection in this area is the wild rabbit. In fact, according to an officially conducted survey in California covering a 25-year period, the rabbit was found to be the source of infection in more than 80 per cent of cases that were recorded during this time. In many of the remaining cases tick bites were involved.

THE INFECTION generally follows inoculation of the skin with the tularemia bacillus. Since the organism is capable of penetrating healthy unbroken skin, no scratch or wound is needed to provide a portal of entry into the body. Even the rubbing of the eye after handling an infected animal may cause the oculoglandular (eye) form of the infection.

A systematic form of the infection may follow the eating of underdone meat or the drinking of water contaminated with the disease organisms.

THE INCUBATION period of tularemia (the time interval between the actual infection and signs of illness) ranges from 24 hours to 10 days but is usually about 3 days. In cases where more than 10 days elapse after suspected exposure to infection, there is little chance that the disease will develop.

Yellowtail At Coronado

After playing second fiddle to superior fishing for heavy yellows in the Point Loma-La Jolla area earlier in the week, the Coronado Islands made a strong comeback last weekend to grab the limelight again and now are threatening to turn up the top yellowtail catches of the year.

Sample hauls were a bag of 31 yellows by four anglers aboard Jack Vance's Betty Lou Saturday and double that catch by a few more fishermen on the same boat Sunday.

Heaviest yellowtail of the week was a 32 pound 2 ounce decked on the New Mascot by A. T. Stevens, of Fortana, giving him the Yellowtail Derby lead.

In addition to improved yellowtail catches, the Coronado Islands also yielded bumper catches of barndoor halibut
