

West Palos Verdes Estates View Home Models Attractively Priced

Seven specially priced model homes are among ocean-view homes now available for early occupancy at West Palos Verdes Estates, reports William C. Kulow, director of sales for the luxury peninsula community. Offered in preparation for moving the display location to a new site, the models all include drapes, carpeting, extra landscaping and sprinkler systems. Some are completely furnished.

Located near the junction of Hawthorne Blvd. and Palos Verdes Drive West, the 79-home development is priced from \$34,400. The spacious residences, with up to 2129 square feet of interior living space, contain three or four bedrooms, family room, and two or three baths.

FEATURES include built-in deluxe gas ranges and automatic dishwashers, glass walls to cement patios, planter dividers, terrazo tile or slate entry hall flooring, intercom with AM and FM radio, hobby rooms within extended garages and custom-styled fire-


places with raised hearths and log lighters. The picturesque southwest coastline of Palos Verdes, and Catalina Island, are seen from West Palos Verdes Estates.

ALSO CURRENTLY being offered by the Grandview Building Co. are homes in the Country Club Unit of Grandview Palos Verdes, in the northern part of the peninsula adjacent to the Palos Verdes Country Club.

These homes are priced from \$28,335. Their location affords many striking views of the Santa Monica Bay and the Los Angeles City basin to the north. Nine furnished model homes may be reached via Crenshaw Blvd. to Silver Spur Rd. and right.

Down payments at Grandview begin at \$1500, plus costs. Twenty-seven year conventional loans are available, with no balloon payments. Special VA terms may be obtained by vets.

Garden Checklist

1. A regular feeding of acid plant food will promote more plant vigor in Bird of Paradise plants.
2. Most California native plants prefer summer dryness, so don't feel sorry for them. You can kill them with kindness.
3. If you like red in the garden, plant a bed of Salvia splendens (Scarlet Sage). Give it full sun.
4. Make you final cutback on Chrysanthemums before the middle of July.
5. Pick seed pods off Fuchsias and you will prolong bloom. Better to pick the faded blooms before they form seed pods.

Harbor College Offers New Electronics Course

Transistors, television fundamentals, and radio code will head the list of technical courses offered at Harbor College during summer session, announced Dr. Robert V. Bacon, Dean of Summer Session.

Operation and testing of transistors as well as their application to computers and compact devices of the space age will be presented in both lecture and laboratory phases of Electronics 22, Transistors.

THE TESTING and troubleshooting of home television circuits will be emphasized in Electronics 21, Television Fundamentals, through the use of the oscilloscope and other laboratory equipment.

Radio code and the electronic theory necessary to pass licensing examinations for amateur and commercial radio operation will be pre-

sented in Electronics 14, Communication Electronics.

George Rainey, electronics instructor for more than a decade, will teach the courses which are scheduled for the evening hours between 6 and 10 p.m.

OTHER technical courses offered during the six-week summer session are automation science, petroleum testing, printing typography, machine typesetting, Linotype - Inter-type, and cylinder presswork operation.

Registration for the summer session will be held on Thursday and Friday, July 6 and 7, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., and from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Classes start on July 10, and will end Aug. 18. No admission tests or transcripts are required, and any high school graduate or person 18 or over may attend.

Priorities for Veterans Hospital Care Outlined

Needed hospital care, within the limits of VA facilities, is generally available to veterans as follows, Veterans Service Officer Sara R. Bridges, Torrance Service Center, said today:

1—A veteran of any war for a service-connected disability incurred or aggravated during a period of war, or for any other disability if such veteran is unable to defer the expenses of necessary hospital care;

2—A veteran whose discharge or release from active service was for a disability incurred or aggravated in line of duty;

3—A person receiving disability compensation from the VA, or who would be except for the receipt of armed forces retirement pay.

FIRST PRIORITY for admission to a Veterans Administration hospital, the service officer emphasized, goes to veterans with service-connected disabilities.

Second on the priority list are veterans with service-connected disabilities who need treatment for some ailment not connected with their service disabilities.

Third in priority are veterans who have no service-connected disability or injury; if

hospitalization is necessary, if they state under oath that they cannot afford to pay hospital charges elsewhere, and if bed-space is available.

EMERGENCY hospitalization is possible under genuine emergency conditions, but whenever possible the attending physician should telephone for permission to admit any patient.

The attending doctor should request ambulance service if needed, because the VA can pay for ambulance service or other transportation of non-service-connected patients only when prior authority has been given. It will depend, too, on the veteran's own ability to pay for travel to the hospital.

Forms for hospital admission are obtainable and arrangements may be expedited through the Veterans Service Office, located at 1622 Gramercy Ave.


