State Spends Less, Gets More in Tax

It cost the State less to collect more in personal income this year.

State Controller Alan Cranston, chairman of the Franchise Tax Board, said a review of the income tax "season" from April 1 through completion of processing returns shows the board staff handled more returns, deposited more money in the treasury, and did it in three days less than was

required last year.

The board received 3,177,204 returns with remittances during the filing period prior to April 17th. This was 186,405 more than last year.

REVENUE deposited amounted to \$221,218,836, which is \$6,735,724 more than a year ago. Processing was completed

May 3 this year, May 6 last year.

"Speed in processing the returns with remittances is desirable because the deposits draw interest of approximately \$85.62 per million dollars a day," Cranston explained. "The Franchise Tax Board staff computes the interest earned by the State on such money during the processing period this year at \$204,006.

Do-it-Yourself Fumigations Require Permit

Do-it-yourself fumigations can not only be dangerous but require a permit issued by the Fire Prevention Bureau, reports Fire Chief J. J. Benner. Residents are advised that with any of the patented "do-it-yourself" fumigants, toxic gases are given off which can cause illness and in extreme cases death.

Permits for the use of fumigants must be obtained 24 hours prior to their use, in order that a physical inspection of the premises may be made by the Fire Department, the Chief stated.
