

Bishop of African Diocese To Address Local Knights

The Most Rev. James Holmes-Siedle, W.F., Bishop in the African nation of Tanganyika, will be the guest speaker during a dinner program to be presented by the Los Crusados council, Knights of Columbus, in the council chambers, 214 Avenue I, Redondo Beach, next Monday at 7 p.m.

Bishop Holmes-Siedle is optimistic about the future of the new African nations. His diocese of Kigoma is across Lake Tanganyika from the Congo. "I am convinced," said the Bishop, "the people do not want Communism. If the Peace Corps doesn't go to Africa," continued the Welsh-born prelate, "someone else will."

One of the first teams of the U.S. Peace Corps, according to the Bishop, will serve in Tanganyika.

Paul Hogan, council lecturer and new chairman of the so-called "buck dinner" committee, directed arrangements for the appearance of Bishop Holmes-Siedle during the dinner for members of the council and their guests. Reservations will not be necessary, but ticket information may be obtained from Hogan or Stacy Rodman, grand knight of the Los Crusados council.

The Bishop will describe the work of the White Fathers' mission in the African nation, which will receive full independence from the British next December.

ORDINANCE NO. 1231
OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE
CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954 ENTITLED "BICYCLES"

AND PLACING THE PROVISIONS RELATING TO BICYCLES IN SECTION 17.28 OF CHAPTER 17 "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby repeal the provisions of the City Code of Torrance, 1954, entitled "Bicycles" which are hereby repealed in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 17.28. Riding Bicycles with- in sidewalk areas or parkways. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a bicycle on any sidewalk or within any park except at a driveway.

SECTION 17.29. Any provision of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistencies and no further, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, or six (6) months in the County Jail of Los Angeles County, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTION 24 OF APPENDIX I OF THE TORRANCE CITY CODE BY STRIKING THEREFROM THE PROVISION WHICH INCORPORATES THE OIL CODE INTO THE LAND USE ORDINANCE.
