Many calls are received by Torrance police each week about the new Go-Cart fad—how the vehicles must be equipped, where they can be driven, and other matters on operation of the new carts. This week we would like to go over some of the rules concerning Go-Carts.


A Go-Cart is a motor driven vehicle and as such is subject to registration. However, they may not be driven on sidewalks, streets, highways, or any other roadway.

HOW THEY are equipped is up to the builder, but when run on private tracks, are subject to whatever regulations have been established by the track operators.

Drivers taking their vehicles to large parking lots, such as those found adjacent to the city's supermarkets, can become the subject of police concern even though on private property. If the property owner presses charges, operators of such vehicles can be cited for disturbing the peace and trespassing.

LOCAL PROPERTY owners have become concerned over the practice because of the danger of civil liability actions against them.

Operators of such vehicles on private property who have not obtained the permission of the owner can be subject to trespass and are liable for prosecution, police warn.

GO-CARTING can be fun and can be safe, police point out. There are certain conditions, however, which must be met. The first, certainly, would be to run the cart on an authorized track where the danger of meeting automobiles and pedestrians has been eliminated. On such a track, the driver is subject to prescribed safety regulations, and does not face the added hazards of street traffic.

Cart drivers on authorized tracks also have the opportunity to compare carts and equipment with other operators, and can pick up pointers from experienced drivers on operation and safety factors for the vehicle.

"REMEMBER, NO Go-Carting on sidewalks or street," Lt. Don Nash of the police traffic division warned. Drivers using public thoroughfares will be cited, he added.

Lieutenant Nash reported that several authorized tracks are being operated in this area, and that he personally has inspected two of these tracks and found the operators anxious to assist all cart owners in any way possible. Operators are in full agreement that the vehicles do not belong on the street.

Anyone interested in starting a club for Go-Cart operators may contact Lt. Nash or Lt. Gus Rethwisch of the police department's juvenile bureau for assistance.

## Glendale Federal Pays Dividends to 128,000

Glendale Federal Savings and Loan Assn. paid more than \$3,175,000 of dividends to its 128,000 savings customers during the second quarter of 1961, it was announced by Charles Wellman, president.

The record total was based upon Glendale Federal's current 4 1/2 per cent dividend rate which the board of directors voted to continue during the coming quarter, Wellman said. Total dividends paid during the first half of the year came to \$6,320,000—nearly \$800,000 or 14 per cent ahead of the

\$5,540,000 total for the first half of 1960, he said.

Glendale Federal's assets now stand at more than \$365,000,000, up \$23,000,000 over the \$342,000,000 Jan. 1 figure. Wellman said this represented a growth in assets of just under \$900,000 for each five-day business week during the first half, and that his association expects to grow at an even greater pace during the next six months of the year.

Mortgage loans at Glendale Federal are headed into their finest year in terms of funds disbursed, Wellman said. During the first five months of 1961, the association made \$55,145,000 of home loans in the Greater Los Angeles area.

## Texaco Moves Torrance Man To Sales Post






