Girl Scouts Slate Week Of Camping

Intermediate Girl Scout Day Camp for East and Central Torrance troops began yesterday at El Nido Park and will run through July 8. Camp is under the supervision of Mmes. William Wilson, director; B. C. Riggs, co-director; James Alexander, crafts consultant and equipment manager; Jim Garland, crafts and campfire; Luther Lancaster, food purchaser; Noel Hayward, nurse; and Warren Ansley, pikie unit.

Camping is "primitive" again this year and will include lashing, semaphore flag signaling, tent pitching, use of axe and knife, cooking, hiking, camp craft skills, and three nights of overnight camping.

Eighty-six girl scouts have registered to attend the full camp program, and have been placed in six units. Each unit is under the supervision of women that have taken a 12 to 15 hour training course.

Scouts are instructed in the art of pitching their own tent on arrival at camp, and will learn to cook over an open campfire. There are 12 senior scouts to help unit leaders during the four days. These girls have been trained by Mrs. L. H. Voien the past few weeks, and are veteran campers.

Intermediate scouts include ages 10 to 12, or any 5th grader "flown-up" by June with a Tenderfoot rank.
