Bureau of Missing Persons Logs High Score for Salvation Army

"My brother has been failing this past year. He's almost totally blind now, and is over 70 years of age. Do you think you could help us find his son, Ned? It would be a wonderful help!"

This letter reached Colonel Pauline Eberhart, Department Lead of The Salvation Army's Missing Persons Bureau in San Francisco last December. With no more to start on... than the fact that Ned Wiley had left his home in the South in 1946 to find a job out West, and that he had written home

six years ago to say that he was working in a copper mine in Arizona... the Missing Persons Bureau went immediately to work on the case.

JUST THIS WEEK, word came from the elderly aunt in Louisiana saying, "Thank you for all your kindness and help. Ned has telephoned us, and will be home next month to see his father. And meanwhile he has sent us a money order for food and medicine."

An extra note on this case, according to a staff secretary,

is that their greatest assistance came from the Postmaster in a small mining town in Arizona. He not only aided in locating Wiley in the area, but also notified The Salvation Army office in San Francisco by air mail of his luck in finding the 45-year-old miner.

THIS IS ONE of the 62 cases marked "successfully closed" for March, 1961 by the Missing Persons Bureau, making it, in the words of one staff member, "a record month."

Inquiries come from Finland,

Buenos Aires, and from just around the corner, asking the Department to help a family find a missing son or daughter.

As Walter Haskell, Centinela Valley Advisory Board chairman, notes, "Each case is handled as carefully as possible, with personal calls made by the Bureau when necessary, letters written to distant cities, and birth and death certificates secured for needed information. Every possible clue is followed up, and it is a heart-warming occasion when a long-lost individual is found for an anxious mother or a hopeful sister."

THE BUREAU of missing persons has been operating as a world-wide service of The Salvation Army for over 75 years, with Salvation Army officers serving as links in this chain. People of all races, creeds and colors have been aided by this Bureau, and as Haskell points out, "The Department works for and with other private welfare agencies, as well as with public officials in its job of finding people."

Last year, over 600 missing persons were located by The Salvation Army's Missing Persons Bureau. This statewide service received 1469 requests for aid during 1960. Locally, inquiries are processed by Lt. Dave Riley, Commanding Officer of the Inglewood Corps.

Union Carbide Distributes Employee Savings

A cash distribution of \$328,187 under an employee savings plan in which the company adds as much as 30 per cent of the employees' savings was made on Friday to more than 283 employees of the Torrance plant of Union Carbide Chemicals Co.

The employees saved \$244,340 of their own money through this plan during the last two years and the company added \$83,847. Union Carbide Chemicals Co. is a division of Union Carbide Corp.

Under this plan, employees set aside up to 7 1/2 per cent of their earnings and the company adds 10, 20, or 30 per cent to this depending on whether the employee has one, two, or three or more years of company service.

The plan contains provisions for short-time savings and long-range investments or a combination of both. This flexibility, which is one of the outstanding features of the plan, permits employees to set aside cash for distribution every two years and also provides the choice of long-range investment in either U.S. Savings Bonds or Union Carbide stock.

Savings plans were made available to Union Carbide employees as early as 1935.
