Former Editor of Warhoop Wins Edith R. Allan Journalism Award

Proof that beauty and scholastic proficiency may be successfully combined was emphasized this week with the announcement that Linda Axenty, El Camino College alumna, has been named winner of the Edith R. Allan Memorial Scholarship in journalism.

Miss Axenty, a former editor of the High Tide of Redondo Beach Union High School and the El Camino Warhoop, received notice of her selection from Dr. Dwight Bentel, head of the department of journalism and advertising at San Jose State College, where she will continue her studies as a journalism major this fall.

IN COMPETITION with leading junior coed journalism majors representing all accredited journalism schools of California colleges and universities, Miss Axenty was notified of her victory by Dr. Bentel, who wrote, "Heartiest congratulations on your winning the Edith R. Allan Memorial Scholarship from the California Newspaper Publishers Assn.

"Their check for \$500 is on my desk and will be deposited in the Scholarship Office for your use next school year. Again congratulations."

AMONG outstanding finalists competing for the award was Miss Verne Christofferson, a fellow editor of the Warhoop and winner of a \$100 journalism scholarship on graduation from El Camino College. Both will return to San Jose State for their senior year, serving on the editorial staff of the college newspaper, the Spartan Daily.

The award followed a series of interviews and written tests.

A FORMER resident of Redondo Beach, the scholarship winner is currently spending the summer with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Axenty, in Lawndale.

While a student at Redondo Beach, Miss Axenty was named Miss Neptune, reigning during the holiday events in that capacity. As a freshman at El Camino College she was chosen Miss Photogenic. Climaxing her honors at the college, she was honored as Homecoming Queen in November, 1959.

MISS AXENTY was named to membership in Corona del Camino, honor group for students who have made outstanding contributions to the college, and was elected vice president of the Associated Students during her sophomore year on campus.
