Torrance High Teacher Writes of Prague Today

(Larry Macaray is a fine arts instructor at Torrance High School. He is currently touring Europe with a tour group that also includes Margaret Hennessy, also a Torrance High teacher, and Gary Parton, a Torrance resident and student at Long Beach State College. He writes today of his visit to Prague.)

I am in Vienna now and leave for Munich in the morning. Our tour has been very enjoyable and we had an exciting time in Prague, Czechoslovakia. We flew from Schonefeld Airport, deep in the Soviet Zone outside of East Berlin, to Prague. What a shame to see how completely the Soviet Union has Czechoslovakia bottled up. Signs of Red domination are everywhere from propaganda coming out of the loudspeakers on the street to subtle scenes inserted at an experimental movie performance theater. Scenes of Russia's success were shown and then an American rocket was shown blowing up on the launching pad.

MANY MILITARY men are on the streets in Prague and very few happy faces are seen. I saw an American Ford parked on the street and a huge crowd was milling around it showing their curiosity about its design. There are very few cars on the streets as gas is over a dollar a gallon and cars are so expensive that the average person can not possibly buy one in a lifetime. It sounds incredible—but true. The beauty of the country side is beyond comparison and our group spent a wonderful day visiting a sculptor museum, an old castle, and a nice river resort area at Slapy Labe, a few miles outside of Prague.

PROBABLY the most memorable hour that I have spent on this tour was spent at the Jewish Memorial in the center of Prague. It is an old stone memorial with the names lettered on the walls of the 80,000 Jews of Prague who were killed by the Nazis during World War II. The old Jewish altar with a list of concentration camps on either side is actually dominated by the absolutely incomprehensible lists of the 80,000 human beings, their names in alphabetical order, with dates of births and deaths of those who died in these camps. All of them are listed, and for

those who want to take pictures of the names of friends or relatives, there is a theatrical light available. As one looks at these names, he can almost hypnotically feel guilt that all people should bear such human slaughter. In any case, it made a very deep impression on me.

WE HAVE been to Copenhagen, Berlin, Prague, and Vienna. Next comes Munich, Milan, Venice, Ravenna, Florence, Rome, Paris, and London. One last thought, when we left the Hotel Europa in Prague and had all of our baggage on the sidewalk waiting for cabs to take us to the airport we suddenly drew a crowd of about 50 people all of them curiously milling about and looking over our baggage—eager to see what was going on.

Print Showing, Talk Highlight Park Activities


