These words from the Emperor lead to humorous complications in the forthcoming El Camino College production of "New Clothes for the Emperor," opening July 21 in the Campus Theater.

El Camino's third summer production is another in the series of popular children's plays presented at the college in the last two years. "Tony Beaver," "Peter Pan," "Aladdin and His Wonderful Lamp" and "The Clown Who Ran Away" make up the roster of earlier plays.

"NEW CLOTHES for the Emperor" runs tomorrow and Saturday at 7:30 p.m., July 21 and at 10:30 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on July 22. Admission is 75 cents with reservations available at the college book store, phone DA 4-6631.

Tickets may also be purchased at the door. In its recounting of the Emperor's vanities and foibles, the play involves two rogues and a Lord Chancellor who provide much of the humor in the play. The rogues are played by Victor Maston and Gary Bradbrook who are new to the El Camino stage but have had extensive experience with other theatrical groups. Paul Wilgening, who has worked in previous El Camino shows as well as with Aviation High School drama productions, plays the Chancellor.

MORE HUMOR comes from Malkyn, played by Judith McGuire, who was seen in "Tony Beaver," "Oklahoma!" "Aladdin and His Wonderful Lamp," and "Hello, Out There" for El Camino. An Aviation High graduate, Miss McGuire is a theater arts major and plans to transfer to Los Angeles State College on completion of her work at El Camino. Love interest finds its way



to the stage through Prince Richard and Princess Dulcis, who overcome formidable obstacles to bring their courtship to a happy conclusion.

Lee Reavis plays Prince Richard, bringing to the part acting experience gained in El Camino's productions of "Oklahoma!" in which he played both Slim and Sab; Nebraska Community Theater's "Sleeping Beauty" in which he played the prince, and "Rumpelstiltskin" in which he also played the prince. He also participated in drama in high school, playing Frank in "Annie Get Your Gun." He plans to continue his major in music at UCLA.

MICHELLE SMITH, who plays Princess Dulcis, numbers among her credits the role of Princess Badrubadur in "Aladdin and His Wonderful Lamp," a part as a dancer in "Tony Beaver," Constance in "The Madwoman of Chailot," and assistant director of "Sabrina Fair." All were El Camino shows.


