



Healing Power Emphasized In Sunday Sermon

"Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts." These words from Zechariah (4:6) are the Golden Text of the Sunday Lesson-Sermon of "Spirit" in all Christian Science churches. The spiritual foundation of divine healing will be emphasized in the sermon.

Matthew's Gospel relates how the Pharisees questioned Jesus, "Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath days? that they might accuse him." Jesus said, "What man shall there be among you, that shall have one sheep, and if it fall into a pit on the sabbath day, will he not lay hold on it, and lift it out? ... Wherefore it is lawful to do well on the sabbath days." Then said he to the man with the withered hand, "Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it forth; and it was restored whole, like unto the other." (12:10-13).

"In 'Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures' Mary Baker Eddy describes the basis of Jesus' healing mission in these words, 'Jesus was unselfish. His spirituality separated Him from sensuousness, and caused the selfish materialist to hate Him; but it was this spirituality which enabled Jesus to heal the sick, cast out evil, and raise the dead' (p. 51).

Lutheran Church Bible School to Begin Monday

The annual vacation Bible School of First Lutheran Church, corner of Carson and Flower St. Rev. William J. Roder, pastor, will be held Aug. 1-18 from 9 to 12, Monday through Friday. All youngsters between the ages of four and 13 are invited to attend.

The theme for the lower grades will be "Jesus Our Savior" and the theme for the grades 4-8 will be "God's Law." The 27 members of the staff have been well versed in the subject material and are eagerly looking forward to sharing the message with the children.

In order to cover the expenses of this school, the board of Christian Education, under the leadership of Mr. Milton H. Carlson, has decided to charge \$1.50 per student for the material to be used. This has enabled them to purchase many fine filmstrips that will assist the children to comprehend the message that is being taught. There'll be handicraft, part of which will be learning to understand the Christian symbols, for all ages.

The school, under the directorship of the Intern Pastor, John Wilker, extends an invitation to the public to share this excellent opportunity for spiritual growth with the members of First Lutheran Church.
