

Second Sister Enlists in WAC Reports Army

A Torrance girl decided to follow in her sister's footsteps by enlisting in the Women's Army Corps this week at the Los Angeles Recruiting Main Station.

Miss Lucretia Ann Wallace, daughter of Mrs. Betty Lu Wallace, 562 1/2 Via de Collado, left this week for the WAC Center, Fort McClellan, Ala., where she will take a military indoctrination course.

Lucretia's sister, Theodora, enlisted in the WAC in April 1961, and is now attending the Neuropsychiatric School, Fort Sam Houston, Tex. Theodora is being trained as a medical specialist in that field and will be assigned to an Army hospital after completion of her training.

Lucretia has other plans for her career as compared to her sister. She enlisted through the Army's "Choose-Your-School" program, for the Finance Procedure Course, Benjamin Harrison, Ind. After her training at the Center, she will attend the Finance School and subsequently be assigned to a job in finance.

Lucretia is a 1961 graduate of South High School, and her sister graduated from the same school in 1960.




