PROTEIN FOODS

You'll probably think of either chicken or turkey for your picnic. Both abundant and priced low. How long has it been since you've been to a box social? Have one for your family... they'll love it. At mealtime just hand out the boxes packed with Cider 'n Spice Chicken, potato chips, carrot and celery sticks, little green onions, and California ripe olives. Have melon or assorted fresh fruit for dessert.

CIDER 'N SPICE CHICKEN (4 servings)

- 1 fryer, cut up
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1/2 spoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup apple juice or cider
- 1 medium onion, chopped fine

Dip chicken in mixture of flour, spices and salt. Set aside for at least 10 minutes. Melt butter in shallow baking pan, add half the cider. Again dip the chicken in seasoned flour then coat in the hot butter-cider mixture. Place skin side down in pan, sprinkle with onion. Bake at 400 degrees about 30 minutes. Turn chicken. Pour on remaining cider. Bake 30 minutes more... or until tender.

BEEF. Fine values, particularly in the long-cooking cuts. Treat your family with a fork-tender pot roast or savory stew.

LAMB. Top quality and many specials.
POPC and VEAL. More of these meats moving to market and veal lends itself well to braising.

Each bid must be submitted on a printed form furnished by the Board of Education; must be sealed and filed in the Business Office on or before Friday, September 15, 1961, at 10 A.M. and will be opened in public at that time and place. Each bid aggregating \$1,000 or over must be accompanied by a certified cashier's check for not less than 5% of the total amount of bid; provided that if only certain items of a bid are accepted the bidder may thereupon substitute a certified cashier's check for 5% of the accepted amount of the bid; and providing further that firms doing business regularly with the Board of Education may at the discretion of the Business Office and in lieu of the

above mentioned check file with the Torrance Unified School District, an annual or continuing surety company's bond in the sum not less than \$500.00 to insure compliance with the terms of their signed bids submitted from time to time during the life of the bond.

The above mentioned check or bidders bond shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will comply with the terms of his signed bid, and if the successful bidder fails thus to comply with the terms of his bid, after acceptance thereof by the Board, his check or bond will be forfeited.

Preference shall be given to supplies, materials or equipment produced by manufacturers or grown in the State of California.

The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or any part of a bid, and to waive any informality in the bids received.

Arts and Crafts Workshop Set in Fall

Crafts Workshop, Art 50 and 51, is being offered in the evening division at Harbor College during the fall semester, announced Laurel Baker, chairman of the construction and art division.

The class will be held on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 9:30, beginning Sept. 14. The beginning section will include work in paper materials such as paper-mache, paper sculpture, torn paper and cardboard structures, as well as in plaster and wood carving, including vermiculite, sand, plasticine modeling, balsa wood and pinewood. The advanced section of the class will work with applied materials, such as cloth and yarn in the creation of tapestries, and with space forms in the construction of mobiles, stables, paper shaping and forming, as well as with new and traditional media in the production of mosaics.

JAMES E. BURK, instructor for the Crafts Workshop class, has exhibited his art work in various Southern California galleries, and has tutored students to success in state and national competitions. He approaches crafts as a creative art. Burk holds a master's degree in fine arts from the University of Southern California where he concentrated in the field of mosaics.

Registration for evening classes is by appointment. Applications are being accepted immediately for registration appointments on Sept. 5, 6 to 8 p.m. Sept. 1 is the last date for the fall semester. Application and registration permits are available at the college admissions office.
