Final Fishoff Slated In Yellowtail Derby

About all that remains in the 15th annual San Diego Yellowtail Derby is the final fishoff for a station wagon and other valuable prizes next Saturday, but everything points to a real display of competitive fire-works on that occasion.

The curtain dropped on the final week of qualifying Saturday, and a check shows that 489 anglers, including ties for last position in the weekly rounds, will be eligible for next Saturday's battle royal. Most of those already have indicated that they will be on the firing line.

Special award for taking the largest derby fish already has been salted away by John Etchandy, of Santa Ana, who bagged a 42 lb., 14 oz. albacore Aug. 28 from Steve Griffin's Sundown.

BECAUSE albacore now are too far off shore to maintain an accurate time schedule, Saturday's fishoff undoubtedly will be aimed at yellowtail alone and the Coronado Islands seem the logical setting. Indicating what is to be expected, the Islands are now packed with yellowtail but too many bonito and other fish make it difficult to get through to the yellows. However, 83 yellows were boated there Saturday on the final day of qualifying.

Top qualifying fish of the final derby week was a 31 lb. 2 oz. albacore caught by Gordon Jung, of San Diego, fishing from Art Seaman's Sable. Other top fish included: 30.6 albacore, D. S. Brodie, Chula Vista (Polaris); 29.12 albacore, Ray Kelson, Riverside (Sabre); 29-8 bluefin tuna, John Driussi, San Bernardino (New Mascot); 28-0 albacore, Bill Nunes, Chula Vista (Polaris).
